

2021 marks the 100th anniversary of the Remembrance Poppy in Canada

Madame Anna Guérin, later christened "The Poppy Lady from France", inspired by John McCrae's "In Flanders Fields", had an idea: to adopt the distribution of the Poppy on Armistice Day as a way to raise money for Veterans' needs and to remember those who had given their lives during the First World War.

In July of 1921 the Great War Veterans Association (which in 1925 would unify with other Veteran groups to form the Canadian Legion) adopted the Poppy as the flower of Remembrance.

Since then, the Legion and its members have upheld this tradition of Remembrance.

RINK REPORT



CORONACH RECREATION BOARD

Everyone entering the Sportsplex, including players, spectators, volunteers, coaches and officials, must adhere to the Saskatchewan Health Authority Return to Play guidelines along with the Coronach Recreation Board's Operating policy (below).

subject to change based on health recommendations

- All patrons who are sick or symptomatic are asked to please stay home and not enter the rink.
- Social distancing is encouraged
- Please use the correct doors (as labeled) to enter and exit the building to avoid congestion.
- Masks will be required for anyone entering the building. At public skating/shinny masks can be removed for those 17 and under while on the ice surface. Anyone 18 and older must have a mask on at all times, on and off the ice. Failure to comply will result in removal from the rink.
- Everyone is encouraged to use hand sanitizer when entering the Sportsplex. Hand sanitizer approved by Health Canada will be available and located in all high traffic areas.
- All patrons of the rink are expected to ensure all garbage and recycling is picked up after their time at the rink to ensure less risk to others.
- Practices/games must follow their scheduled times to allow for proper cleaning and disinfecting in between teams.
- In between games/practices and on a regular basis all high touch areas as well as dressing rooms/benches will be cleaned and disinfected. Coronach Sportsplex will be using Buckeye Terminator which is a heavy duty quaternary based disinfectant, cleaner, sanitizer and deodorizer. The EPA has approved Buckeye Terminator for use against SARS-Related Coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) {cause of Covid-19} with a 3 minute contact time at a 2 oz/gallon dilution rate.
- Spiting is prohibited
- Trainers/coaches/parents must wear a mask and disposable gloves when treating players/skaters for any injuries.

PUBLIC SKATING

- * first and foremost please remember to thank Hart Butte Community Farms for paying for your public skating time!
- * the Coronach Rec Board is allowing volunteers to supervise public skating this season as long as the public health guidelines are followed
- * if you would like to supervise please text Jeff at 267-7297 for the code to the key box, and then post on Facebook the time that you will be supervising.
- * while you are there you must enforce the masking policy in the lobby area and for those over 18 on the ice area.
- * when your time is up you'll make sure everyone has left the building, turn off lights and put key back into the key box
- * It is your responsibility to pick up all garbage and recycling and put in proper bins.
- * 1/2 the ice is for skaters and 1/2 is for shinny. If there is no skaters there you can have full ice (and vice versa) BUT if skaters show up you must give them 1/2 the ice
- * if you go out with a stick in your hand you must have a helmet on your head
- * please when its done, make sure pucks/chairs/etc are picked up from ice surface, then when next flood is put on someone doesn't have to spend time cleaning up first.

Southern Sask., Montana groups partner to create cross-border tours

By Kelly Skjerven Global News October 17, 2021

A South Saskatchewan group has partnered with Missouri River Country in Montana to organize cross-border tours. South Saskatchewan Ready has been created to come up with strategies and plans to mitigate the negative economic impacts of transitioning away from coal.

The federal government has committed to ceasing operations at most coal plants by 2030.

Tourism is one of the industries the group is looking at to drive economic activity.

Sean Wallace, managing director of South Saskatchewan Ready, said the idea came about after he recalled living in New Brunswick, close to the border.

"We know that provincial ggovernments often times have agreements with some of our southern cousins. We know the federal government has agreements with other countries in terms of trade and economic development," Wallace said.

"So we basically said, 'well you know what, I don't think there's a reason why we couldn't explore doing an agreement with some folks that we're very close with in the Montana border to develop some tourism products."

This week's announcement that the land border will open for non-essential travel on Nov. 8 is welcome news to both groups.

Wallace said the groups plan to create itineraries that incorporate attractions in each community.

"We want to basically do itineraries that have a good flow that we can visit every community within both regions and not do a whole lot of backtracking," Wallace said.

There will be eight counties included in Montana and nine communities in Saskatchewan; Bengough, Coronach,

There will be eight counties included in Montana and nine communities in Saskatchewan; Bengough, Coronach, Rockglen, Willow Bunch, RM of Bengough, RM of Happy Valley, RM of Hart Butte, RM of Poplar Valley, and RM of Willow Bunch.

"Attractions in each community will be a part of the itinerary, no one's going to be left out," Wallace said.

"This is a valuable partnership for both South Saskatchewan Ready and Montana's Missouri River Country. We look forward to increasing tourism and the economic impact that it will have on our regions," said Carla Hunsley of Montana's Missouri River Country.

Wallace thanked Tourism Saskatchewan, as well as the federal and provincial governments for their support and financial assistance throughout the group's mission to transition from the coal industry.

Itineraries will available in May on the South Saskatchewan Ready website and Montana's Missouri River Country website.

Hello Coronach! My name is Brandi Dahlman and I am the Healthcare Counsellor for the south central part of the province. I am going to be coming to Coronach **every Tuesday** for the day. I am available through referral from the doctors that come or from the Nurse Practitioner. Please don't hesitate to book in and be connected to me!

What is Primary Healthcare?

Primary Healthcare is often the first point of contact when someone is needing health services whether that is mental or physical. Primary Healthcare teams include doctors, nurses, nurse practitioners, social workers, dieticians, pharmacists, EMT's, counsellors and also community workers and volunteers, etc. The goal is for all the members to work together to provide the best level of care to the patient. We want the care to be patient-centered and for the patient to be empowered and included in all decisions involved in their care.

What is a Primary Healthcare Counsellor?

My role as a Healthcare Counsellor is to work alongside all of these key members and help provide brief, counselling and psychoeducation for those needing some extra mental health and wellness supports in their life. I work with anxiety, depression, stress management, health and wellness, smoking cessation, chronic disease/pain management, mild substance use, parenting issues, postpartum depression, grief, communication/goal setting, self-esteem etc. I am available through referrals from general practitioners and nurse practitioners. I also hope to help bring extra supports and resources to the community!
