Coronach Comunity Hall History

The Coronach Community Hall was built by the community in the year 1946. Vern Cornwall and Don Beattie were the first managers of the hall. It was built as a 3 star movie theatre and many dances were held there over the years. The first owner of the building was Earl McPeek and then after that it was Jurgen Lundy. While Jurgen owned it they installed the bowling ally that they had bought from Wood Mountain. Trenches/holes were dug in front west side of building to slide in the long parts of the bowling alley which Reinhard Wagner re-assembled and built into the alley it is today. Then in the 70's the Coronach Kinsmen purchased the hall and they installed the automatic pin setters. Unfortunately, in their time as owners the hall had a fire. The Saturday night there was a wedding dance and Monday morning the fire was detected, assumption was a cigerette butt. With the insurance money and the Winter Works grant the lean too was built (currently where we enter the building and where kitchen is) As for the inside of the building the damage was limited to the basement so the place was scrubbed down good and then painted. The floors are original and were redone in the 1980's by the Kinsmen. In the late 90's the Elks took over operation of the hall until about 2013. Then they sold the hall to the Town of Coronach for \$1.

When the town was managing the hall, Linda Poirier approached council and said that she was going to form a board to bring the hall back to life. And boy, did they ever! They had a hard working crew that got money from the town, the RM and donations from Southland Coop and they renovated the hall from top to bottom. They painted, they sanded floors, waxed floors, redid bathrooms, upgraded lighting throughout the whole building, put in a sound room (where theatre balcony used to be) cleaned everywhere and restocked the building. In that time the board also secured money from grants to do even more. They received money from Hart Butte Community Farms that resurfaced the bowling alley, the money from Sask Lotteries bought darts and pool balls, the Coronach Recreation Fundraising Committee gave them money for 55 new pairs of bowling shoes and new bowling balls as well as all the donations of fridges, games and more from community members.

Since the hall was upgraded and the board reinvented it has been a busy place. Dance lessons, bowling nights, smear tournaments, pre-Christmas bonanza, New Years eve celebrations, Big Muddy Players, birthday parties, meetings, funerals and dances have all been held there over the last 5 years.

But it's not just the last 5 years that contain all these events, the hall has always been the place in town to celebrate or to mourn as a community. This year that building is 75 years old and the memories that are contained in those walls over all these years are immeasurable to our town and its people.

On November 3 smoke was detected at the Hall and the fire department was contacted. A fire had started on the main floor and did damage, the extent not yet known. The hall is currently closed a awaiting results and reports to know what the next steps will be in the future of the Hall.



At this time, we are waiting for quotes to remove the asbestos (as confirmed by testing and required by SGI) and then structural engineering will be completed before we make decisions or plans.

The Town of Coronach would like to recognize Cecil Keast for his lifetime devotion and pride to our community and for donating a building to the Town by naming a street in his honour on the day that would have been his 100th birthday (November 19, 2021). South of the intersection of Centre Street and South Avenue will now be known as Cecil Keast Way.

Cecil and Isabel Keast donated the building at 117 Centre Street to the Town of Coronach in 2019 which is now known as the Tourism Booth. Cecil built the building for Canada Post and it opened for business on January 1955, on the day his daughter was born. He was postmaster from 1945 to 1978 and the building served as the post office until 1982. When he retired from the post office, Cecil set up an accounting office at 125 Centre Street. In his accounting business he enjoyed consultations with people of all ages and was happy to give free advice. He liked helping people. So he worked until he was 90!

It is an extensive list of all the local boards, committees and projects Cecil contributed to. He was secretary manager for the building and manager of Coronach's first hospital, and he set up a fund to keep Coronach donations in Coronach after amalgamating with Weyburn. He acted as "Receiver" for the Coronach Hotel and the Rockglen Hotel. When the power plant and mine were first being set up, and the gov't ignored all the town's concerns, Cecil had a wartime solution to get everyone's attention: cut the road! He worked with the Poplar River Surface Rights Association to obtain fair land prices and to make land reclamation mandatory. He was secretary for the Borderland Grazing Co-op. He was secretary for the Town of Fife Lake for twenty years. He was the secretary-treasurer for the Municipal Building Committee for the construction of the Sportsplex. He was one of the overseers of "Two Valley Construction Company" that built ten homes in Willow Bunch and ten homes in Coronach for low-income families. He was overseer for the "Big Muddy Beavers", a non-profit organization which provided employment geared toward community improvement. He was also a Justice of the Peace.

Cecil passed away in 2019 and condolences are extended to the family as his wife Isabel passed away earlier this month. The Keast family and name is one synonymous with our community and history and we are thankful for all their contributions.



In Loving sabel Keast - 1928-2021

Isabel Marie Greenwood was born September 28, 1928 to Rachel (Brown) and Robert Greenwood at Assiniboia Hospital. Her journey ended November 3, 2021 at Assiniboia Hospital, 93 years later. She grew up on a farm five miles north of Coronach until her mother's deteriorating health forced the family to move to BC in search of a cure. The healing waters of Soap Lake, Washington and the clinic of Shraq doctors (brothers) cured her paralysis. The family returned after a year in Vancouver to the farm. Life on the farm was a lot of work for all, but it involved a lot of laughter and shenanigans, like the day she and her friend Joan rerouted the survey stakes for a road that ran between their farms. To this day, we're not sure if the curve for the correction line is their doing or not. Isabel moved to Coronach to complete her high school, then moved to Regina to work for the Wheat Pool and Simpson Sears. She lived with Alice Keast, who worked for the competitor, Eaton's.

After the war, Isabel met the love of her life, Cecil Keast, and they married in 1948. Her new career began in the post office working alongside Cecil, and she continued in the post office for 45 years. Cecil retired from the post office in 1978, leaving it in Isabel's hands, and opened an accounting office across the street in what is now The Whistlestop. Of course, when Isabel retired from the post office, she moved across the street to again work alongside her husband until at the age of 83 she and Cecil both retired. Although that retirement only meant that they didn't go into the office any more, they

still did accounting at home, and were called upon by various citizens and groups for advice. Coming from the farm, Isabel had a love of animals, and there was always at least one four-legged friend in the house. Isabel took an oil painting class at age 50 and discovered a love and exceptional talent for painting. The wolf that is on the back of her headstone is one of her favourites.

Isabel had a sense of humour and often said how important laughter was in their life—in facing things together and finding something to be thankful for and to laugh about each day. After 71 years of marriage, they were still by each other's side, thankful for the many good things in their life. Along with laughter came a sharp mind and quick wit which she retained until the very end. When being assessed for admission to long term care, one of the questions was to use "screwdriver" and "hammer" in a sentence. She quickly responded, "If I had enough screwdrivers, I'd get hammered."

At age 93, Isabel is predeceased by her parents, her siblings, her husband, and most of her friends. She leaves behind a daughter Colleen Pritchard (Allen), grandson Shane, granddaughter Mandy, great-grandson Adriel, and many nieces and nephews and their families

Merry Facts about Christmas Lights

Thomas Edison strung the first Christmas lights in 1882. The father of the light bulb, Thomas Edison, invented long strands of lights in 1880 and was used 2 years later as a decoration.

The first lights were very expensive. As their popularity grew, getting a full set of lights, a generator and wiring services would cost as much as \$2000 in today's dollars to illuminate a Christmas tree with electric lights! Thankfully, a breakthrough came in 1903 when GE (General Electric) created the first pre-wired 8-socket strings of lights

Blinking lights are a miracle of science! Ever felt enchanted by those lights that blink elegantly in a delightful on-off pattern? All it takes is a simple thermostat that controls this in an on-off pattern. When you plug in your lights, a strip of metal inside the bulb is heated by the electricity until it bends. This will then break the circuit and turns off the light. The strip will then cool and reconnect to the same circuit again, allowing the light to reappear.

The Guinness World Record for most lights hung belongs to a family. A family in New York in 2014 decorated a 2-acre space with 601,736 lights, outstripping even the famous 2016 Rockefeller Christmas Tree that was decorated with 50,000 lights.

Let's chat former hometown girl Danielle Clavelle. Danielle recently went to Norway to represent Canada in the Powerlifting World Open Equipped Championships. Danielle placed 8th overall and is sharing her experience with us-



When did you move to Coronach? I lived in Coronach almost my whole childhood, we moved away for a few years in elementary school but I still spent most of my summers visiting Coronach friends while away. Moved back to stay in Grade 5!

Where do you call home now? I currently live in Calgary, Alberta

What got you started in weight lifting/training? I started weightlifting in 2015 when I started personal training. I had been working out for years on and off and a friend followed my journey. Eventually, they offered to mentor me as a personal trainer where I found powerlifting! As soon as I started my first powerlifting training program I was hooked. I finally felt empowered by what my body could do instead of how it looked. I stopped working out to appear how society thought I should and found something that made me feel alive, brought me a new community to thrive in, and so much joy. I started powerlifting in September of 2015 and competed May 2016. I had a strong squat right away so I placed well and quickly went on to the Regional and National championships.

How did you qulaify for this event in Norway? To qualify for Worlds 2021 I had won Canadian National Championships in Winnipeg in March 2020. The spot was to be for a 2020 spot, but obviously the world had other plans, however my win still secured my spot for the following year. This was a big year because the Worlds winners of 2021 would claim a spot to The World Games in 2022. The most prestigious event in all of Powerlifting world wide. Though I did not place top 3 there are still possibilities I could take a regional spot. One day I aspire to go.

What is your next goal to work towards? My next goals are to head to St.Johns in March 2022 for the Canadian National Championships, win another Worlds spot and spend the next few years working as hard as I can to be competitive enough for the World Games. The World Games comes every four years so I have a couple years to get more practice.
