Mural Description

With great fortitude we watch as we live in constant parallels with nature. Unshakable and undeniably unformidable, Mother Nature and her creatures are outstanding and resilient. As we move forward into unprecedented times, we are reminded of the beauty that is always gifted to us ever so effortlessly. Through the seasons as we wait for the spring to arrive to plant each seed for a hopeful and abundant harvest. Through the highs and lows we take a step into a new direction with endless possibilities to shift and grow. A crest I have created for The Town of Coronach, my hope is that this is what this mural will become a badge of true civic pride. Within it each corner from North, South to East and West honouring the four directions and the land we are privileged to live on.

With respect to agriculture here in the south with direct alignment to the leading lentil that is cared for and grown here by many local farmers, in addition to the nourishing chief flax. As the breadbasket of the north, here we share a visual storytelling of the generations of seeds that have been grown and harvested time and time again. To the sweet Saskatoon berries that are grown in the local orchard in Coronach to which also grow wild near the Big Muddy.

This mural and green space is a renewed opportunity for equity and a deep reminder that through the fabric of community. Your collective unity holds the tie that binds. A town that has given of itself without question. For those who have stayed and those folks that go on like the diverse ever changing sky. Like the deer giving of its hide, its body, its spirit. To the orbs/sentient beings, your ancestors that have passed and new lives ready to be birthed. 
Few things to remember this season:



This system can call you at home, text you, or email you or you can have the Voyent App on your smart phone for alerts.

This system will help us communicate more effectively in emergencies, and it will reach people that don't use online sources for their information if they are signed up. You can sign up through the **Townofcoronach.ca** home page, download the Voyent! App. If you have someone that does not use a computer or smart phone but they need a text or phone call when there is an alert, we can help you set that up, just call or visit the Town Office at 306-267-2150



Voyent TIP: You can sign up for more than one location, work and home and you can sign up even if you don't live in town limits. If you live out of town, you can sign up and use the school, a family member's address or a work address to receive notifications. Notices will be transmitted, sent or called to the affected area only unless there is a town-wide notice when everyone signed up would receive a notice.

# ANGER PEAC

#### Let's Chat!

With the new COVID restrictions being announced, you may be feeling down, depressed, angry, frustrated, defeated, like no progress is being made and many more emotions. This is normal and this is valid! It is important that we take the time to acknowledge and feel any feelings that we need too while also trying to find healthy and productive ways to express them.

Anger is a helpful emotion when it matches the situation you are in and motivates a person to take action or work towards a goal. However, anger that is dealt with in unhealthy ways can start to affect your well-being.

Ways to express angry and frustration in a healthy/productive way:

- Leave the situation if you can.
- 2. Take a deep breath. Try to get these breaths to come from your stomach and not your chest.
- 3. Count to 10 before responding.
- 4. Repeat calming phrases such as "I am ok." "Breathe."
- 5. Try to shift your attention to something more pleasant or something that brings you joy.
- 6. Acknowledge you feelings- try not to avoid or bottle them.
- 7. Check to see if your reaction matches the situation. "Is this situation as bad as I am making it out to be?"
- 8. Look at your thoughts and language towards the situation. These may be fueling the anger. "This is the worst thing in the world." "Life is over." "I cannot live like this." This is all very heavy, intense language that catastrophizes the situation.
- 9. Identify the true source of your anger. What are you truly angry at in the situation?
- 10. Focus on what is in your control vs. out of your control. If it is something you can control, make a plan. If it is something you cannot control, let it go. Put things into perspective.
- 11. Find humor if you can.
- 12. Exercise. Self-care. Sleep. Appetite. Supports. Check in with yourself in these areas. Room for improvement?

If your anger or frustration starts to become something that you cannot handle on your own, reach out and ask for help.

1. Notice the worty.




