



Fife Lake Hotel holds 2022 Kinsmen Telemiracle Fundraiser

ASSINIBOIA - To say that Lawson Harkness from Fife Lake was ‘gob-smacked’, when this reporter walked into the Fife Lake Hotel Sunday evening, would be a gross understatement. “The generosity of Saskatchewan people just astounds me. It completely blows my mind!” blurted out Lawson. “Do you know that four dozen cinnamon buns just sold here today for \$1,200? Can you believe that? That’s unbelievable!” he boasted proudly with the biggest grin ever on his face. Those tasty temptation treats Lawson was referring to were donated by Connie Swanson of Assiniboia. She donates to the Fife Lake Hotel auction and Telemiracle fundraiser every year. What’s really unbelievable is that even 29 years of fundraising for the Saskatchewan Kinsmen Telemiracle Telethon, Harkness and his lovely wife Gail have not lost their passion or enthusiasm for this great and worthwhile cause. Gail and Lawson have owned and operated the Fife Lake Hotel for more than 48 years.

Over the years they have seen a lot of changes. Two things, however, have not changed - their commitment to supporting Telemiracle, and the generosity of Saskatchewan people. This year’s attendance at the Fife Lake Hotel’s auction and fundraiser was down considerably by about 50 per cent, but still they managed to raise \$27,115.25.

“That’s a record,” stated Lawson proudly. “Not bad for a small town of only 27 people!” Last year, in the midst of the COVID-19 global pandemic, Lawson and Gail managed to raise \$16,430. That in itself was pretty amazing, but what’s really amazing, is that - In total, over the past 29 years - they have raised more than \$265,000. Think about that. That’s more than a quarter million dollars. A ton of hard work went into raising that amount of money. Gail begins working early in January to solicit and gather donations of new or used items to be placed up for auction at their hotel just prior to Telemiracle. This year’s auction was held last Sunday afternoon and evening, February 27. Said Gail, after the miraculous, yet exhausting event: “I would like to thank the Kinsmen Telemiracle organization, Kelly Clarke and Mason Richard - our auctioneers - and everyone who purchased and donated items for this very worthy cause. Without these caring and generous folks, none of this would have happened!”

NEWS FLASH: “Ditto to you, Gail and Lawson Harkness.” Without you, none of this would ever have happened. You’re a shining example of what caring and community are all about.

French toast bites
INGREDIENTS



4 thick (1") slices white bread, slightly stale
2 large eggs
1/4 cup milk
Pinch of salt
1-2 tbsp. OLiv Butter Extra Virgin Olive Oil (EV00)
1/4 cup white sugar
1/2 tsp cinnamon powder
Maple syrup to serve
DIRECTIONS



Cut bread into cubes.
Whisk the eggs, milk and salt in a medium bowl.
Combine sugar and cinnamon in a shallow bowl. Set aside.
Melt 1-2 tbsp of Butter EV00 in a frying pan over medium high heat.
Toss bread cubes in the egg mixture and shake off excess egg mixture. Place the bread cubes in the frying pan until all sides are browned - about 2 to 3 minutes.
Remove the bread cubes from the frying pan and drop straight into sugar mixture. Toss to coat, then place onto a plate.
Repeat with remaining bread cubes.
Serve immediately, with maple syrup for dipping.



Council Meeting Highlights - March 8th, 2022

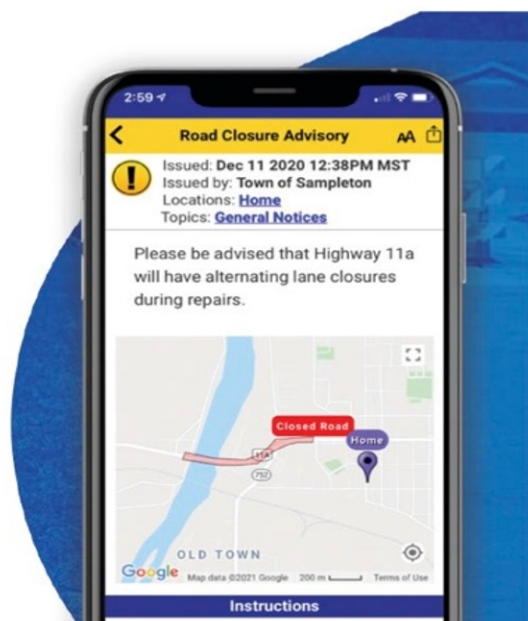
1. The Community Hall abatement is complete. The report from SGI will be reviewed by council at the March 22nd, 2022 Council meeting. The Town will proceed with repairs to the Hall to the extent of our insurance coverage with repairs to the roof trusses, fire/smoke/water damage, electrical, furnaces etc. The Town would like to thank the volunteers that helped on March 18th, 2022 and will keep you updated. The next step is to get quotes for demolition of damage and re-construction.
2. Under Bylaw 10.2021, seasonal disconnects are \$35.00 for the staff's time and labor to operate the curb stop/water valve and ensure service is disconnected/ reconnected and the administrative processing.
3. The Public Notice Bylaw 1.2022 has been adopted by the Town of Coronach. The intention of this is to ensure all decisions by council that fall within *The Municipalities Act* are included in the new bylaw.
4. Welcome your new neighbors to Coronach! Whether you have returned to Coronach or are new to Town, WELCOME! In 2021, there were 23 homes sold and purchased in Coronach; 1 New Business purchased building (Clark Mechanical) at 223 South Avenue; plus 4 Estate related ownership changes; and 2 Tax Title Properties (properties acquired through Tax Enforcement) were sold and 3 other empty lots acquired through Tax Enforcement. Watch for news from the new Community Coordinator, Michelle, for ways to get out and greet one another again!
5. Sewage pumping Lift Station alarm responses monthly due to wipes and grease and personal hygiene products cost the tax payer approximately \$350.00 per call out? We hope that sharing this information with you builds awareness of the costs of these non-flushable items in our sewer system. To date we have had 7 overtime calls in 2022 related to wipes and grease in the Sewage lift station for a cost to all taxpayers of \$2450.00 year to date.
6. As of April 7th, the Town of Coronach Fax line will be disconnected. There were only 4 non-spam faxes sent in the last 18 months. This will be savings of \$54.43/month. Our email addresses are:
