TOWN OF CORONACH

BYLAW NO. 3 of 1984

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF CORONACH IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN TO AMEND BYLAW NO. 6 of 1978 KNOWN AS THE TRAFFIC BYLAW.

The Council of the Town of Coronach, in the Province of Saskatchewan, hereby enacts as follows:

- Bylaw No. 6 of 1978 is amended as hereinafter set forth.
- Section 3 (1) (b) is amended by deleting the words "and the intersection with South Avenue".
- Section 3 (1) (j) is amended by deleting the words "with Second Street West" in the first line.
- By adding the following Section 3 (1.1) Four way stop signs shall be located as follows:
 - (a) At the intersection of First Avenue and First Street West.
 - (b) At the intersection of First Avenue and Second amended Street West. apr 12/88
 - (c) At the intersection of South Avenue and First Street East.
- Section 3 (2) (e) is amended by deleting the words "the intersection with South Avenue and".
- 6. By adding the following Section 3 (1.2)Three way stop signs shall be located as follows:
 - (a) At the intersection of South Avenue and Poplar Street.
- Bylaws No. 5 of 1982 and No. 6 of 1982 are hereby repealed.
- This bylaw shall come into force on the date of its approval by the Highway Traffic Board.
