May is a month to be thankful, we have so many people in our community to celebrate this month.

Teacher Appreciation Day - May 3 - Teacher Appreciation Day seems to have been started in 2018 as a way to show more appreciation for teachers. It is observed annually on the Tuesday of the first full week in May.

According to the Canadian Ministry of Education, in 2020, there were 85,538 elementary teachers and 40,927 secondary teachers.

International Firefighters Day - May 4 - It is celebrated on May 4th because that is Saint Florian's day, and Saint Florian, who was said to be one of the first commanding firefighters of an actual Roman battalion and saved many lives, is the patron saint of firefighters.

Mothers Day - May 8 - always celebrated on the second Sunday of May in Canada. Mother's Day was founded by Anna Marie Jarvis who wanted to honor her deceased mother. She campaigned for a day where mothers will have a special day of their own – where they would be honored, acknowledged, and appreciated. On the mentioned year, 1908, Anna Jarvis held a memorial for her mother at St Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia, USA. This event marked the first ever modern celebration of Mother's Day.

National Nurses Week - May 9-15 - The National Nursing Week annual celebrations take place from the Monday to the Sunday of the same week as Florence Nightingale's birthday, May 12.

The theme this year is #WeAnswerTheCall and was developed by CNA to showcase the many roles that nurses play in a patient's health-care journey. The pandemic brought to light the courage and commitment that nurses work under every day and showed the important role that nurses play in the community. During National Nursing Week, we celebrate the incredible work and dedication of nursing team members across Canada. We also take the opportunity to thank and acknowledge all front-line health care workers.

Canada's health care system depends on the commitment and work of registered practical nurses (RPNs), licensed practical nurses (LPNs) and registered nurses (RNs) working in hospitals, long-term care institutions, community organizations, and in patients' homes.

Paramedic Services Week- May 22 – 28, 2022. The theme for Paramedic Services week, "Faces of Paramedicine". This is a time to show our gratitude and appreciation to the paramedics who work every day to keep us and our communities safe. This week, please remember to honor your ambulance paramedics, people who are dedicated to serving you in your greatest time of need.

and because there isn't a day to celebrate RCMP we'll honor them this month as well :) The Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) was founded in 1920 by the joining of the Dominion Police (a federal police force in the eastern part of Canada) and the Northwest Mounted Police (established to police the newly acquired Northwest Territories). The distinctive red colored dress uniform of the RCMP, popularly referred to as Red Serge, was adopted from the Northwest Mounted Police and was styled in order to reflect the British character of the police force. The image and name of the RCMP was trademarked in 1995 with the intended purpose of preserving the image and reputation of the force.

All of these groups contribute to our lives in our community, through education, wellness and safety. Small towns face challenges everyday but we are truly lucky to have the resources we have, the skills people possess and the dedication they bestow on their community.

Coronach Fire Department International Firefighters Day – May 4



C.F.D. is a full service Fire Dept. Servicing the Town of Coronach and the Village of Big Beaver Sk. It also services the R.M.'s of Hart Butte, Happy Valley, Poplar Valley, and Willow Bunch. We provide Fire and Rescue capabilities as well as Medical First Responders. Many of the Coronach Fire Department members hold multiple certifications and qualifications in the Emergency Fire, Rescue, and Medical fields. Our membership also has the opportunity to receive training and certifications throughout the year which many take the opportunity to go. Our department meets the standards for a fire department under the provisions set forth by the Province and the Office of the Fire Commissioner. This is in the requirements for apparatus specifications and certifications, the number of apparatus for our response area, personal safety equipment, and training for members.

Our department currently has a membership of 15 firefighters. We are always looking for and accepting more applicants. The department is comprised of the following:

The department currently operates 4 year round apparatus and 1 seasonal apparatus. We have 2 structure rated Pumpers, 1 Tanker/Tender, and 1 Multi-purpose rescue/brush truck. 3 of these units have Foam capability. For spring, summer and fall we bring out our old pumper from storage as another field/rural truck that adds another 1000 gallons of water and pumping capabilities for field fires etc.

Our rescue capability is comprised of 2 sets of Jaws of Life, The new vehicle technology set and the old low pressure set kept as back-ups to our primary set. Also we have many other tools at our disposal on the units for rescue operations. Some examples are heavy duty immobilization jacks used for stabilizing regular vehicles up to busses and semis, air bags, cribbing and blocking and a great assortment of power tools and generators to run them.

Our First responder component is comprised of an Automated External Defibrillator and a full First Responder kit Bag. We also have specialized backboard and equipment for removing a casualty from a motor vehicle collision safely while minimizing damage to the head and spine.

CFD also does fire extinguisher inspections, service, and sales. Building inspections requested by the property owner are also another service that is provided by the fire department. These inspections are done differently than inspections mandated by the governing authority that has jurisdiction.

I, Gavin Perry, Chief of Coronach Fire Department, would like to let everyone know how proud I am to be a member of Coronach Fire, and how very proud I am of the Fire Fighters of CFD. These individuals give up their time from family and events at the drop of a hat (or the alarm of the callout) to keep Coronach and the surrounding areas safe, and to minimize the loss of property. The members train hard and keep up to date on new policies and procedures. This amount of commitment comes not as their "job" but their desire to keep you safe. All of our members have other full time jobs in and around the community and the time they invest is additional to their careers and family life. Every call we attend to, we do our best with the situations and resources available to us, and every call is an opportunity to learn. If anyone feels the tug to do more and help keep your family and neighbours safe please join us. We welcome anyone who wants to give back to the community. 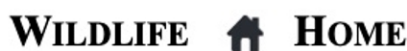

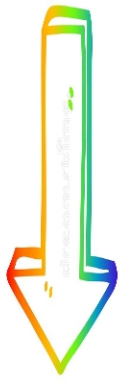

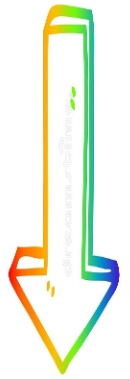
