





What is the summer solstice?

This year it is Tuesday, June 21



The 'longest' day of the year marks the middle of summer.

This is because the tilt of the Earth's axis is most aligned with the sun, providing us with the most daylight of the year.

When it ends, the nights will began to close in as our planet rotates away from the sun. Solstice comes from the Latin words sol, meaning Sun and sistere, meaning to come to a stop or stand still. On the day of the June solstice, the Sun reaches its northernmost position, as see from the Earth. At that moment, its zenith does not move north or south as during most other days of the year, but it stands still at the Tropic of Cancer. It then reverses its direction and starts moving south again.



Congratulations to our 2022 Saddle Making Fellowship Recipient, Nicole Kirby.

Nicole Kirby is from Southern Saskatchewan, Canada not far from the Montana border. Nicole farms and ranches with her husband and children. She is kept busy with day to day ranchlife, working alongside her husband, as well as helping their children with online home schooling, hauling kids to ropings and high school rodeo, and of course, custom leatherwork.

With a love of horses and a creative heart, saddle making naturally caught her attention many years ago. Through the kindness of a local saddlemaker, she was introduced to the basics of leatherwork and saddlery while in her early twenties. A twenty year span in the nursing profession delayed some of her artistic pursuits but the draw of leatherworking and creating with her hands remained a constant. Rodeo awards, horse gear, ladies shoes and fashion items as well as figure carving and leather art kept her up late many a night. Nicole travelled, when able, for leather classes and loves teaching beginner leathercraft workshops, especially for kids.



What is Elder Abuse?

"Elder abuse is an intentional act or failure to act that causes or creates a risk of harm to an older adult. An older adult is someone age 60 or older. The abuse occurs at the hands of a caregiver or a person the elder trusts."

Abuse includes physical, sexual, emotional/psychological, neglect and financial abuse.


