Keeping Sportsplex Cool

The Town of Coronach and the Coronach Recreation Board are pleased to announce that funds have been secured for a new ice plant at the Sportsplex.

Federal funding of \$240,000 was provided through the Canada Community Revitalization Fund (CCRF) which is administered by Prairies Economic Development Canada (Prairies Can). SaskPower has also contributed \$100,000 to this project and the remaining approximately \$100,000 will be provided by local support.

The current ice plant is estimated to be well over 30 years old. Due to ongoing issues with an aging system and high maintenance and repair costs, it is time for a replacement. A new ice plant will ensure the community is able to provide winter recreation opportunities for many years. A new plant will also be much more energy efficient and decrease operating expense.

"Our government is proud to support community infrastructure projects like the Town of Coronach, through the Canada Community Revitalization Fund. Rinks like these are a staple in the Prairies, especially in rural communities. They are a place where friends and families gather to skate, curl or watch the local hockey team play against a neighbouring town," said the Honourable Daniel Vandal, Minister for Prairies Can. "The Town of Coronach's new ice plant will ensure that residents and visitors can continue to enjoy the rink, and make memories, for years to come."

"SaskPower values its deep and long-standing ties with Coronach," said Tim Eckel, SaskPower Vice-President of Asset Management, Planning and Sustainability. "We are pleased to contribute to this project, which demonstrates our ongoing partnership with the local community."



Council Meeting Highlights - June 14th, 2022

- Tax Notices will be sent out by June 30th, 2022. A 6% discount on Municipal Property Tax (Education Property Tax cannot be discounted) will be available until July 31st, 2022. All payments received to current taxes by July 31st 2022 will receive the discount. You can Pay online with Conexus Credit Union, CIBC or in the Office by Credit card, check or cash, Tax Payments are due in Full by December 31st, 2022.
- 2. The Town and the RM of Hart Butte are listing 331 Westview Drive for sale. Our goal is to use the funds from the sale of the house to purchase a Van our residents in the Coronach Health Centre with the goal of serving the Seniors community for out-of-town appointments. This a partnership with the Coronach Health Advisory Committee and the Coronach Health Centre, the Town of Coronach and the R.M. of Hart Butte.
- 3. Thank you to Coronach Economic Development Officer, Kelsey Manske, who has worked with Jeff Dionne and the Coronach Recreation Board to secure \$240,000 in funding for the Coronach Sportsplex Ice Plant replacement. Kelsey is launching a support and business development program for store front and home-based businesses through Prairies Canada Funding and our partners at Conexus Credit Union, watch for details.
- 4. The Generator for the Sewage Lift station will be connected in July and fully commissioned. This \$38,885.00 generator and extensive ventilation and electrical improvements to the lift station was made possible by the Municipal Economic Enhancement Program and the Infrastructure Investment Plan funded by the Province of Saskatchewan.
- 5. The Community Hall demolition of fire damage has been completed. Council will review the cost estimates approved by SGI to determine the extent of renovations /rebuild that can be managed with minimal tax burden. We expect that the extensive scope of work by SGI, could to take up to 10 months to complete if approved.
- 6. The Town Administrator is working on a grant through Veteran Affairs to restore the existing cenotaph in the Coronach Cemetery installed in 1952 for those who gave the ultimate sacrifice in service for our freedom. Please reach out to the Canadian Legion members or Town Council with your ideas and input.
- 14. The annual Public Works and Nuisance Tour will take place on the week of July 11th, 2022. As per Bylaw 4.2006, Section 9 regulates any land with overgrown grass or weeds not cut by June 1 or 30 days thereafter in any year may be cut by town employees and the costs for the same added to the taxes of the land. For the purposes of this section, "overgrown" means in excess of 0.20 meters in height. Any property in the Town of Coronach with any nuisance conditions will be notified by mail and Orders given under this Bylaw shall comply with Section 364 of *The Municipalities Act* and Orders given under Bylaw shall be served in accordance with Section 390(1)(a), (b) or (c) of *The Municipalities Act*.

A "nuisance" means a condition of property, or a thing, or an activity, that adversely affects or may adversely affect:

- i) the safety, health or welfare of people in the neighborhood;
- ii) people's use and enjoyment of their property; or
- *iii) the amenity of a neighborhood and includes:*
- i) a building in a ruinous or dilapidated state of repair;
- ii) an unoccupied building that is damaged and is an imminent danger to public safety;
- iii) land that is overgrown with grass and weeds;
- iv) untidy and unsightly property;
- v) junked vehicles; and
- vi) open excavations on property;

Downtown Coronach Renewal 2022-2025 Update:

The goal of the application for this Downtown Coronach Renewal funding was to give the local "brick and mortar" business district a boost in the format of new water and sewer services and an improved image in the business district with new paving and sidewalks. The key focus of this project was to replace the 1964 infrastructure underground services with new reliable, sustainable services and to improve the function and impression in the business district with newly paved streets and new sidewalks. There would be improvements to water flow and control, so that in the event of a break there would be minimal disruption to the businesses.

The tenders for the underground portion of the work (Phase one) demonstrate that the costs of the first phase are going to be 40-50% higher than the 2021 estimates and we expect this for paving and sidewalk renewal in Phase 2. Due to the increasing cost of materials and fuel for construction in 2022 and projected into 2023, Council has reviewed the scope of work and the priorities of the project. After long discussion, we have determined to scale back the project to stay within the grant funding to minimize any tax costs to the residents and businesses. This will result in underground construction starting in April-May 2023.

Council resolved that the scope of work be reduced in size to include the following:

- Water & sewer mains and service connections will be replaced up to the property lines on Centre Street from Railway Avenue to South Avenue. Angle parking will be maintained on the north half of Centre Street. On the south half of Centre Street there will be a section of angle parking at CR Plumbing to Rustic Tavern for business services and the rest of the street will be parallel parking along the remaining sidewalks with an increase in green space along the south section of the street.
- 2. Water, Sewer mains and service connections will be replaced up to the property line for connections from South Avenue from 1st Street West to 1st Street East. This section of South Avenue will have narrower pavement and green space will be added on both sides of street. The Town Council has no intention to increase or change property lines when the grass and or trees are added in this section when the road is narrowed.
- 3. On 1st Avenue (for one block on either side of Centre Street) there will be a directionally bored water line added that will connect to the services on 1st Avenue East to the Services west of 1st Street West. This will improve water flow and control for any water line works in the future to reduce control areas for line repairs.
- 4. A storm water management system is to be installed to move storm water through a drain basin and culvert system away from residents towards the low area that is west of the ball diamonds where water can flow to the low-level crossing.
- All water control valves in the original work area will be replaced. This means only sections of surface replacement where these valves are replaced. This includes valves on:
 - South Avenue from 1st Street East to 1st Street West,
 - b. Centre Street from Railway to South Avenue,
 - c. 1st Street East from Railway to South Avenue
 - d. 1st Street West from Railway to South Avenue
 - e. Intersections on 1st Avenue at 1st Street East and 1st Street West.
- 6. The main service water line from the water treatment plant to the south end of 1st Street East (by Golf Course) will be replaced by directional boring. There will be some excavation at the Water Treatment Plant and we will continue working with the Golf Club once this is finalized.
- Streetlight standards on Centre Street will be replaced in the process of new sidewalks.
