2022-2023 Canadian Winter Forecast Summary

- * Winter will arrive early, with cold temperatures dropping down from the Yukon and northern Alberta to settle in across the Prairies and into southern Ontario and southwest Quebec.
- * By mid- to late November 2022, icebox conditions will arrive—to likely worsen as the season progresses. For example, in January, temperatures on the Prairies will average 7°C below normal.
- * While temperatures throughout the rest of Canada will be normal or nearly so, this doesn't mean that these areas will be spared their own winter woes: Several major snowstorms are predicted for southern Quebec and Atlantic Canada, with the first arriving before the end of November!
- * Much of Ontario will also see increased snow, while the southern portions of the Prairies and most of British Columbia will sometimes be more wet than white, with sleet and freezing rain more prevalent than usual.

Basic life saving pickup fee is \$245 for Saskatchewan residents

Advanced life saving pickup fee is \$325

Basic fee for non provincial residents is \$360

There is also a kilometer fee of \$2.30 for rural residents

There is also a wait time fee of \$50-\$100/ hour if ambulance waits in large center to return patients home There is extra fees for special escorts if ex:other health care professionals or nurse has to ride along for care If Stars or Air ambulance have to be called to intercept patients for transport there is a fee of \$465 per flight

Ambulance can respond to a patients home and if the paramedics find the patients can go by car or if the patient refuses to be transported there is a fee of half the base rate, it is no longer a no charge service.

Council Meeting Highlights -September 13th, 2022

- 1. The Town of Coronach Staff and Council are happy to announce that the Generator backup system at the Sewage Lift station is fully commissioned and operational. This means a consistent and reliable backup power supply ensures sewage is pumped to the lagoons during power outages and reduces stress for our hardworking crew. There are more upgrades to come with new alarm systems in internal electronics and improved ventilation. Thank you to the Municipal Economic Enhancement Program for funding this project.
- 2. Thank you for your support of the Hall in the purchases of the items from 331 Westview. The sale proceeds from the house, co-owned by the Town and RM of Hart Butte, are dedicated to a van program for seniors and health centre residents to travel to appointments and events. We will keep you posted on the progress of this program.
- 3. The Town of Coronach will be discontinuing the rental of 6-yard red bins effective October 1st, 2022 due to higher-than-expected costs for the ongoing rental, delivery and coordination of the bins that would result in raising the rental fees by four times our current rates. Any demolition waste can be taken to the landfill/transfer station. Rates and times for the transfer/landfill are available at Townofcoronach.ca/government/municipal services.
- 4. As we approach winter, remember to clear your sidewalks for pedestrians and that snow and sanding equipment will be on the roads. Please stay 2 car lengths away from any snow equipment to ensure safety and the safety of our operators.
- 5. We remind you that the Used Oil Depot at the Town shop was closed on September 30th, 2022. A tender for the Oil tank collection unit will be posted upon the decision of the council.
- 6. If you require a large green waste collection of bagged leaves, please call the town office. This service is \$50.00/collection (maximum half-ton truckload per collection). Bags must be compostable or paper, regular clear or black or orange garbage bags will pay additional charges will be applied for labour to open and empty bags by the staff at the landfill.


