World War I ended on the 11th month on the 11th day on the 11th nour in 1918 - 104 years ago.

Almost 200,000 Canadians were killed or wounded in the First World War. Another 68,000 were killed or wounded in the Second World War. More than 150 Canadians were killed in Afghanistan and at least 130 Canadian soldiers have died in peacekeeping missions.

A poppy should be worn on their left side, the red represents the blood of all those who gave their lives, the black represents the mourning of those who didn't have their loved ones return home and green leaf represents the grass and crops growing and future prosperity after the war destroyed so much. The leaf should be positioned at II o'clock to represent the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month, when the war officially ended. The money raised by legions asking for donations for poppies around the world is used for helping injured and retired soldiers.

It should be worn from the last day of October until November 11th, at 11:00am. The Legion suggests it should then be placed at a cenotaph as opposed to being thrown away.

The bugle is often played at military funerals and on Remembrance Day, to symbolize that soldiers can rest in peace. In war the bugle was used to tell soldiers it was time to return to their barracks and sleep.

Dear Veterans,

Those of us who have not served will never fully understand the sacrifice's you've made both in times of peace and of war.

We will never fully understand what you were required to do or how you were able to do it.

We will never fully understand the depth of your scars.

But what we can offer you is this:

We see you.





Why do geese fly in V formation?

As each bird flaps its wings, it creates an uplift for the bird immediately following. By flying in a V formation the whole flock adds at least 71% greater flying range than if each bird flew on its own. When a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to go it alone and quickly gets back in formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird in front. When the head goose gets tired, it rotates back in the wing and another goose moves into his place. Geese honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed. When a goose gets sick or wounded by gunshots and falls out of formation, two other geese fall out with that goose and follow it down to the ground and stay with it to lend help and protection. They stay with the fallen goose until it is able to fly again or until it dies. Only then do they launch out on their own, or with another formation to catch up with their group.

This letter is to let you know of a need for seniors of Coronach. Recently a decision was made to upgrade the piano at South Winds Manor apartments. Their present piano is very old and in poor condition. The piano tuner informed the residents that it is no longer serviceable. The old piano at the Coronach Health Center should be replaced with a better piano, for the residents.

These pianos are used often. At the nursing home the piano is used every week. Music is a vital part of the seniors lives. The pianos are used for singsongs, church groups, music recitals, special occasions and residents and their family members.

Music brings peace and joy for all seniors. It is comforting to those suffering of loneliness, anxiety, depression or Alzheimer's disease. Good electric pianos would be best for the senior apartments and the nursing home. We are not wanting to replace old pianos with old pianos. A new electric piano with a fully weighted keyboard is the best as far as cost because it doesn't have to have an expensive tuning every year. The pianos I am looking at have excellent grand piano tone. The fundraiser for the 2 pianos is with activity director May Warken at South Winds Manor and with nurse, Jennie Noll RN, in charge of residents activities at the nursing home. The cost of the 2 pianos will be about \$7,000.00 altogether, tax included.

These 2 quality pianos will last for many years to come. Any help you can give will be deeply appreciated. Thank you in advance for supporting the men and women who have contributed so much to our community.

RINK REPORT

Ice plant update....

The original plan was to have the ice in and ready for use by November 15th. A majority of our ice plant components have arrived in Saskatoon but unfortunately there has been some delays with the supply of our chillers. They are not scheduled to arrive to Saskatoon until November 12th. once in Saskatoon there is two weeks of work to complete assembly followed by two weeks of installation at the rink. This will move our opening to roughly December 14th.

Postech from Regina came to the Sportsplex Friday, October 21 and installed screw piles to support the new condenser. This will be the first step towards installing the new plant. Thanks for understanding and please know we are doing our best to keep this project moving as fast as we can to get everybody out on the ice.



What happens when you recycle?



ALUMINUM

Aluminum cans keep coming back as the same thing, over and over again. A can returned to Sarcan today could be back on the store shelf in just 90 days. It takes 95% less energy to recycle than to make new aluminum - and there's no limit to how many times aluminum can be recycled!



Colored glass bottles are collected, crushed and sold for use in fiberglass insulation. Have you ever wondered what makes highway paint shine at night? It is made of recycled clear glass. The glass is melted into spheres and then added directly to the road paint.



Tin is used as a de-oxidant in the process to make recycled steel. Steel is then made into a variety of things including car parts, rebar and steel pipe.



PLASTIC [PET]

Plastic containers are squashed, and then shredded into plastic flakes which makes new bottles, buckets and pails. It is also used to create polyester fiber to use in fleece clothing and high grade carpet. Your jacket or carpet could be made from a bottle you drank out of!

JUICE BOXES [TETRA]

Tetra containers have seven layers of aluminum, paper and plastic. Through a process called hydro-pulping, the layers are separated. The resulting paper pulp is made into corrugate, napkins and more. The plastic makes plastic wood and aluminum is used for energy recovery.



PLASTIC [HDPE]

The plastic in these containers is separated and can be mixed with other types of plastic to make park benches, bins and other sturdy products.

PAPER CARTONS & GABLE TOP

These containers also go through hydropulping to separate the paper from other materials. The paper fiber is then made into boxes, cardboard and gypsum board.


