Splish Splash! The pool is getting some cash!

The Federal Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs, Infrastructure and Communities, and Saskatchewan's Government Relations Minister recently announced funding that will be going towards revitalizing our swimming pool!

A total of \$1,059,619 will be contributed to the project with a contribution of \$578,000 from the Federal government and a \$481,619 contribution from the Provincial government.

The estimated total for the complete project is \$1,445,000. Of the remaining \$385,000 that will have to be fundraised, over \$60,000 has been raised through the Coronach Recreation Board. Make sure to get those Chase the Ace tickets and watch for more fundraisers!

The anticipated date to start construction is the fall of 2024 with completion mid-summer 2025.

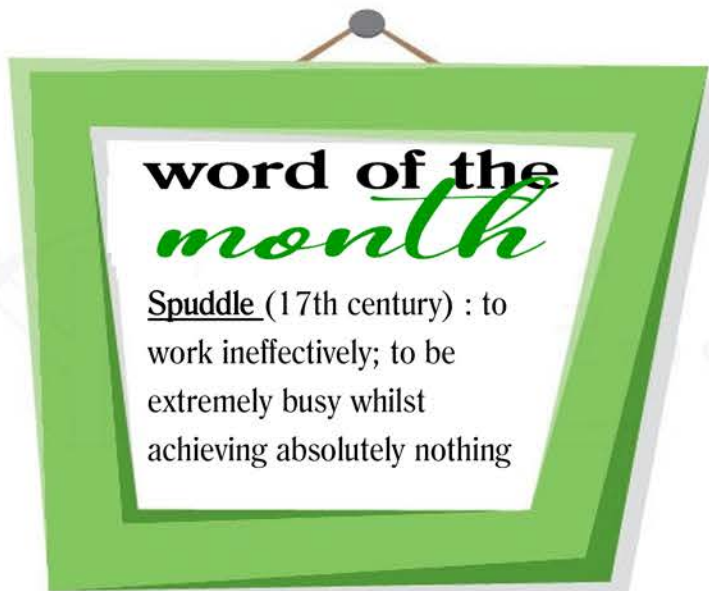
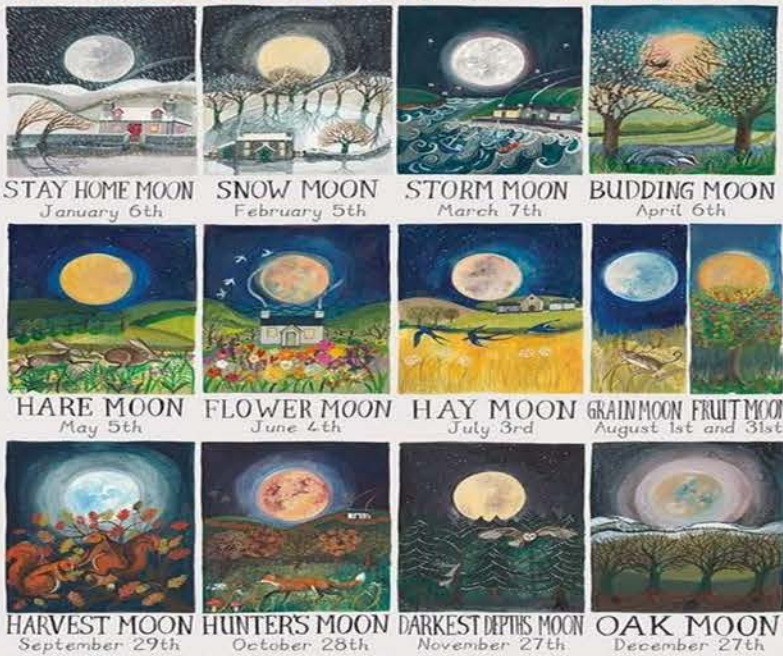

Tell us about yourself (whatever you'd like to share) I grew up in a small out-port community in Newfoundland and only moved away from there when I joined the RCMP. I don't mind living in small communities because that is what I'm use to. I'm an Electronics Engineering Technologist by trade and worked in that field for a number of years. How to Talk to Your Kids About Drugs

Drug use is all around us in our communities whether we see it or not. Your kids will be exposed to some form of drug use at some point in their lives. It is very important as parents, that we are able to have open conversations about drugs and let kids be comfortable talking about it!

1. Ask your kids what they know about drugs.
2. Make sure you are listening and approaching in a non-judgmental way.
3. Always frame conversations in age appropriate terms.
4. Discuss the legal issues with drugs, health concerns, injury and death, consequences of driving under the influence, etc.
5. Remember to focus on healthy life choices and not just the negative ones.
6. Encourage your kids to be involved in sports and hobbies.
7. Get to know your kids friends and their families.
8. Make your home a place where your kids feel comfortable having their friends around.
9. Let your kids know that you will be there for them- no questions asked.
10. Show kids the raw and scary realities of drug use. It is a myth that if they are exposed to the realities of drug use (shows like intervention, books, pictures, etc.) that they will decide to use.
11. Let your kids know about the rules and consequences your household has that revolve around substance use.
12. Have a conversation with kids about how to turn down drugs or alcohol.
13. Find time in your day to let kids discuss their day and their feelings.
14. Make family time a priority and keep kids busy and involved.
15. Pay attention to your kids' lives and tune in to when they may be going through a hard time.
16. Know what resources are out there and don't be afraid to ask for help!

Council Meeting Highlights – February 14th, 2022

1. **SaskTel and South Saskatchewan Ready (SSR) partner to bring inFiNET service to four communities in Southern Saskatchewan!** We are thrilled to announce that the Town of Coronach is one of four communities in our region to be upgraded Fibre Optic internet service. This new upgrade is for every house and business, and installation is scheduled for this year! This program allows SaskTel to expand services quickly and sustainably to areas of the province where it may not otherwise be economically feasible to do so. SaskTel will be contacting property owners to work on this installation program.
SSR is contributing nearly \$2 million of funding they've secured from Prairies Economic Development Canada (Prairies Can) towards the project. "Coal Transition has many economic challenges, especially in rural regions where economies are largely undiversified. SaskTel's fibre optic broadband network will provide our regional population centres with opportunities to compete with larger centres for economic opportunities," said Sharon Adam, Chair, South Saskatchewan Ready.
2. The Coronach Business Hub program has been extended to March 31, 2024, thanks to Kelsey Manske and Christina Birch's engagement with local businesses. This year long extension will mean extending training, business development and networking for our local businesses. Follow **Coronach Business Networking Group** on Facebook or contact Kelsey Manske at coronach.edc@gmail.com to learn about the new E-Learning platform for business support. This is for anyone in the area, home and farm-based business, brick-and-mortar business, from the comfort of your home! As part of this funding, you can learn more about the Coronach Youth in Business Entrepreneur training program at Coronach Youth in Business on Facebook, they are open to new members and looking for a mentor to continue to program.
3. The Town office has received complaints of excessive dog barking in multiple areas of town over the last 3 months. The Town of Coronach Animal Control Bylaw 3.2017 has ways for the Town to address barking dog issues, but to send a notice to alert the owner we need to have the address or owner's name.
We understand that most animal owners do not realize that their pet is disturbing their neighbors, especially if they are away at work. If you have a problem with a noisy dog, consider letting your neighbour know that their dog is barking and is keeping you up at night, disturbing your baby's sleep, etc. In most cases the owner will be sympathetic and try to rectify this problem. It is important to be aware that all dogs will bark at some point, and nuisance barking isn't that the dog barks, it is that the dog continuously barks for long periods of time. You can call or visit the Town Office with your complaint, but please offer the specific address where the dog resides to help us resolve the problem.

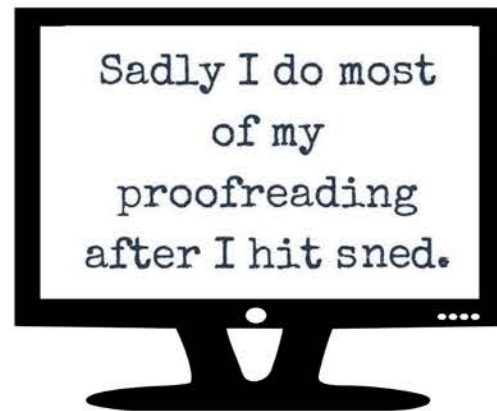
