She campaigned for a day where mothers will have a special day of their own – where they would be honored, acknowledged, and appreciated. On the mentioned year, 1908, Anna Jarvis held a memorial for her mother at St Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia, USA. This event marked the first ever modern celebration of Mother's Day.

National Nurses Week - May 8-14 - The National Nursing Week annual celebrations take place from the Monday to the Sunday of the same week as Florence Nightingale's birthday, May 12.

The theme this year is *Our Nurses. Our Future.* This theme showcases the many roles that nurses play in a patient's health-care journey. The pandemic brought to light the courage and commitment that nurses work under every day and showed the important role that nurses play in the community.

Paramedic Services Week- May 21 – 27, EMS Week is a perfect time to honor those frontline heroes dedicated to providing emergency medicine that saves so many lives every day. The 2023 EMS Week theme: "Where Emergency Care Begins" This week, please remember to honor your ambulance paramedics, people who are dedicated to serving you in your greatest time of need.

and because there isn't a day to celebrate RCMP we'll honor them this month as well:) The Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) was founded in 1920 by the joining of the Dominion Police (a federal police force in the eastern part of Canada) and the Northwest Mounted Police (established to police the newly acquired Northwest Territories). The distinctive red colored dress uniform of the RCMP, popularly referred to as Red Serge, was adopted from the Northwest Mounted Police and was styled in order to reflect the British character of the police force. The image and name of the RCMP was trademarked in 1995 with the intended purpose of preserving the image and reputation of the force.

All of these groups contribute to our lives in our community, through education, wellness and safety. Small towns face challenges everyday but we are truly lucky to have the resources we have, the skills people possess and the dedication they bestow on their community.

Primary Healthcare Counsellor Final Newsletter

The Primary Healthcare Counsellor (Brandi Dahlman) is transitioning to the role of Behavioral Health Consultant. With this, comes some changes. This will be the final newsletter submission from the PHCC.

What to expect when you meet with the BHC?

The BHC will ask you specific questions about your physical, emotional concerns and behaviors and how those are affecting your overall health. The BHC and your provider work together to provide



brief, solution focused solutions. How do I schedule an appointment with the BHC?

Talk with your primary care provider to access this service.

What is a Behavioral Health Consultant?

A BHC works alonside your primary care provider whenever your health involves more then just physical factors. Anytime your thoughts, habits, behaviors, emotions or any combination of these impact your health the BHC can be called in. What kind of concerns does the BHC see?

Headaches, sleep concerns, high blood pressure, asthma, obesity, chronic pain, IBS, smoking cessation, weight loss, alcohol use, exercise,

lifestyle modification, sexual dysfunction, anxiety, depression, stress, bereavement How does this service differ from traditional mental health

services? This service is another part of your overall healthcare and is not specialty mental health services. Notes are kept in your medical record with no extra mental

health record kept. Your BHC does not provide specialty psychotherapy. If you feel you would benefit from this, a referral can be facilitated.
