The Town will be removing dead trees on town property in the fall of 2024. If you have any trees on your property that need to be cut, please contact the Town Office to be added to the list. Once the tender is placed and awarded, the list will be provided to the contractor. The contractor will arrange with you directly for business and compensation.

Effective April 1, 2024, Collection Day for Garbage and Recycling roll-out carts will switch to Friday's. Please be sure to have your bin placed at your curb by 7 a.m. for pickup. Commercial garbage and recycling will continue to be emptied on Monday/Tuesday.

Downtown Flower Supply 2024 The Town of Coronach is tendering the supply and delivery of the flowers for the 2024 season. Hanging Baskets will not be filled this year due to ongoing construction during spring through until August and the resulting removal of the planter standards.

Your tender should include costs for: 18 large light green spikes, 90 tidal or wave petunias- any cohesive mixture of 2 colors, and 8 light green sweet potato. A tender is to be submitted in a sealed envelope marked "Coronach Plant Tender" and addressed to the Town of Coronach, Box 90, Coronach SK S0H 0Z0. Tenders shall be postmarked or dropped off at the Town Office by 5:00 pm on January 8, 2024. The highest, or any tender, is not necessarily accepted. Tenders will be opened on January 9, 2024 at 6:00 p.m. at the Town Office, 212 1st Street East, Coronach, SK S0H0Z0.

Just a reminder to keep your cat or dog within arm's reach or on a leash. There have been multiple concerns with pets running loose. Please also ensure your pet has a collar with a tag and owners' information if it accidentally escapes. This is to ensure the owner is located in a timely manner. For all cats and dogs in Town Limits, a license is required yearly. Please stop by the Town Office to purchase if you already haven't. Thank you for your cooperation!



Ukraine moves Christmas to December 25, distancing itself from Russian tradition

Ukraine has passed legislation moving its official Christmas holiday to December 25, further distancing itself from the traditions of the Putin-aligned Russian Orthodox Church, which celebrates the holiday on January 7.

The legislation's sponsors said its passage would help Ukraine "abandon the Russian heritage of imposing the celebration of Christmas on January 7," and help Ukrainians "live their own life with their own traditions (and) holidays."

Russia's war in Ukraine further accelerated the divide between the two branches of Orthodox Christianity, especially given that the head of Russia's Orthodox Church, Patriarch Kirill, fully endorsed the invasion and framed it as a culture clash between the wider Russian world and Western liberal values.

The new law will effectively formalize what some churches in Ukraine had already begun practicing. A branch of the Orthodox Church of Ukraine allowed its churches to celebrate Christmas on December 25 last year. Ukraine's main Greek Catholic church said in February it was moving to a new calendar to celebrate Christmas on December 25 as well.

The decision appears to be popular. In December, the Ukrainian government launched a poll asking citizens whether the date for Christmas should be moved to December 25. Nearly 59% of the more than 1.5 million people who voted supported such a move.

ACTUAL CASH VALUE VS REPLACEMENT COST

Actual Cash Value (ACV)- is Replacement Cost LESS Depreciation at the time of the loss. ACV takes into account the age, condition, resale value, obsolescence and normal life expectancy of the property at the time of loss.

Replacement Cost- Cost to repair or replace property with material of similar kind and quality with today's prices WITHOUT deduction for depreciation.

Unless Replacement Cost is specified on your policy, all property will be determined at Actual Cash Value. It is up to you, the insured, to monitor the value of your property listed on your policy. Review your policy every year to ensure you have adequate value for your property listed on your insurance policy.

Replacement Cost is also restricted to a specified time frame;

- Automobiles- Replacement Cost is for the first 5 years you own the new automobile. You can add this to your Auto Policy up to 120 days from date of purchase.
- Farm Equipment- Replacement cost is for the first 5 years you own the new equipment
- Dwelling- Replacement Cost must be specified on your policy. The dwelling has to be built in 1960 or later, if not certain requirements must be met. You must also complete an RCT (home evaluator) every 5 years in order to keep Replacement Cost on your policy for your dwelling
- Belongings- as long as Replacement Cost is specified on your policy
- Outbuildings- Replacement Cost must be specified on your policy and added at the time the building is built.

Option 1

- Birth Certificate
