



# Helen Kathryn Foley July 5, 1929 - January 18, 2024

Helen Kathryn Foley of Coronach, SK, passed peacefully surrounded by family, on January 18, 2024, at the age of 94 years. Helen was born in Regina, SK on July 5, 1929, the daughter of Marie Schuff. When Helen was 3 years old, her mother died and she was adopted by her Aunt Barbara and Uncle Jake Noll of Coronach. Her brother John (Jackie) Noll was born in 1936. At age 7, Helen attended Highcrest School. She learned to read and books soon provided her with much enjoyment. Besides helping with the household chores, Helen soon learned to help with many farm chores like feeding the animals, milking the cows, and cleaning the barn and chicken coop. She finished her Grade 12 at Coronach School and then went to teachers' college to

Helen taught school until she married Elmer Foley on November 8, 1951. They started cattle and grain farming, and then six children arrived to complete their family: John in 1953, Kevin in 1955, Jeannie in 1957, Gregory in 1961, Barbara in 1965, and Timothy in 1968. Without modern day conveniences, Helen cooked, baked and cleaned for her large family, and she also helped with outside chores and fieldwork.

In the 1970s, Elmer and Helen imported a Simmental heifer from Switzerland and began to build their own full blood herd. Helen was instrumental in keeping the paperwork done for selling their bulls near and far. All buyers who visited the farm would be treated to Helen's fresh bread, buns and donuts.

In 1980, they built a new home on a farm closer to Coronach. Helen liked all the trees in the yard, especially the trees that lined both sides of the lane from the road to the house.

In 1992, Helen found out that she had a sister, Mary, that was born days before their birth mother passed in 1933. They were both overjoyed to find each other and they enjoyed learning about each other and their families over the years.

Helen was the secretary for the Coronach Agricultural Society for many years and worked hard to keep the annual agricultural fair running. She also was active in the rink world with hockey players and figure skaters. She served on the Coronach Museum board and loved bringing history to life for the young people. She wrote many stories for the Coronach History book. She was active in the church: reading at Mass, lay services, secretary of the parish council, and a CWL member for many years. She felt it was vital to volunteer in your community.

Helen's retirement hobbies were tending to her garden, braiding rugs, bowling, playing Chinese checkers, cribbage and many other card games. She even dabbled with painting pictures again. She also continued making her famous bread and buns and pies, and hosting all our family gatherings every Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas.

The family would like to thank the Coronach Health Centre Staff. Your compassion and exceptional care during Mom's stay were deeply appreciated. Donations in Mom's memory may be made to the Coronach Ladies Hospital Auxiliary or STARS Air Ambulance.

A Funeral Mass was celebrated on Friday, January 26, 2024, at 2:00 p.m., at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Roman Catholic Church, Coronach, SK, with celebrant Father Clement Amofah. Cross Bearer Kevin Foley. Candle Bearers Greg Foley and Tim Foley. Urn Bearer John Foley. The Paschal Candle was lit by Tim Foley. Readers were Elena Diebel and Jennifer Foley. Offertory gifts were presented by Jeannie Gardiner and Barbara Diebel. Music was played by Linda Poirier. The eulogy was read by Justin Foley. Interment took place at the Coronach Cemetery.

**Question:** "What's the regulation on excessive dog barking, what do we do as a local and what's consequences for dog owners?"

**Answer:** "The Town of Coronach has Bylaw 3.2017 A Bylaw to License and Regulate Animals. Within the Bylaw, section 5 outlines barking dogs and/or howling. Section 5 reads as follows:

- 5.1. No person who owns or keeps a dog or allows it to stay in the owner's premises shall allow such dog to bark excessively or howl excessively;
- 5.2. Any person who allows a dog to bark or howl excessively shall be deemed guilty of an infraction of this bylaw;5.3. Any person who hears a dog barking or howling excessively and can positively identify the animal, can file a written complaint at the Town Office. Written complaints must include information as set out in Form 1 attached to this bylaw (Policy OSL.28);
- 5.4. The municipality may issue a written order if there is anything in the physical environment that the dog is being kept in that can be remedied that would prevent said dog from barking or howling;5.5. The municipality may apply to a judge to have a dog that barks or howls excessively, at the owner's expense, muzzled, fitted with a collar or device that deters barking or permanently removed from the municipality; and,5.6. The municipality may issue a written infraction notice, in the appropriate Municipal form, under this or the Municipal Noise Bylaw.Bylaw 3.2017 is available here: https://townofcoronach.ca/government/policies/ or a copy of the Bylaw can be obtained from the Town Office.

The Town requires a resident to come to the Town Office to formally make a written complaint of the animal. Once a written complaint is received, the CAO sends the owner a formal letter with a copy of the Bylaw attached for their reference. The resident who submitted the formal complaint, is kept confidential. If there are still concerns with barking or howling after 1-2 weeks, after a written complaint is filed, please feel free to reach out to the Town Office again. It can take 1-2 weeks for the letter to be mailed and for the resident to pick up their mail. Recently, the Town Office has had a few complaints of dogs and letters were sent. We have not heard from residents since expressing concern. If there are still issues, please let us know and we will proceed with further action.

Just a reminder Membership Dues are due in March. Memberships are \$15. Just give me a call anytime, 267-2237.





Brennon Dulle's Story

TMy name is Brennon Dulle, this is my second year doing this. I would like to share my story with you with the hope that you will lend your support.

On October 31, 2015 I suffered a life changing stroke at 33 years old. Halloween was the day of my stroke. A day after the stroke I had a seizure. Due to the seizure my brain needed its 1st Surgery. After my 1st brain surgery, I started seizure pills. In 2017 I was having seizures a week so I my 2nd brain surgery That took out a part of my brain. That stopped my seizures for about a year. Then it became intense I got up to 6 different seizure pills on high doses and many different tries of different pills. Since 2018 I've had hundreds of seizures that will last 5 minutes to an hour and 45 minutes, Stars Aft Ambulance has been utilized to save my life. Since then, I Have had 2 brain surgery in Saskatchewan, and 2 more in Calgary, Alberta to alleviate the seizures. Our province did not have the needed equipment or specialized staff to preform my last two surgeries, needing help I had to fight with the government to go to Calgary to get the surgeries I needed. I finally received the approvals my surgeries were done in June and August of 2022.

The neurology department at RUH, while incredibly educated and talented, struggle to meet the demands of Saskatchewan due to outdated equipment and lack of funding available to stay current. The money fundraised by Dulle Neurology Fundraiser, will go directly towards updating equipment and facilities.

On April 6th 2024. I will be hosting a dinner at TCU place. We will be having a supper. The MC We'll be Natalie Tilbury A third year medical student Interested in neurology. A presentation from Dr. Alexandra Carter. There will be raffle, doors prizes, 50/50 and a Country singer Kleran Gardner Playing a couple of songs. The fundraiser will go from 5:30 PM Until 11 PM.
