HAY AND DITCH MOWING

The Municipality follows the Ministry of Highways rules and guidelines for haying and ditch mowing.

Key dates for hay salvage:

July 8: Prior to and including this date, a landowner or lessee nearest to a highway ditch has the first opportunity to cut or bale hay.

After July 8: Cut and bale hay on a first come, first serve basis. The nearest landowner's permission is not required after this date. Cutting and baling hay should not be initiated if the mowing contractor is mowing near the area.

August 8: All hay bales must be removed from ditches, or they may be removed and disposed of at the ministry's discretion. After August 8: Bales must be removed immediately following haying operations.



A history lesson....

As our Coronach golf season has begun for another year I would like to submit a little history of the Coronach golf club and present golf course, as written in quoted by Marvin Day and Dave Aldous... Submitted by Marv's daughter Valerie Rousseau.

Mary quoted, "A few names events and dates may be missing so we apologize if anyone or events have been forgotten.

About 1930

The first course was set up north of the railway tracks on land which was known as Sandy Jackson's pasture. Some of the people responsible for this course were Frank Day, Bob Flynn, Gerald Devlin, Clem Boughen, Elmer Keyes, Vic Livington. The greens are very small with no sand or flags and the cups mermaid using 28 oz tomato cans. Most of the wives or friends of the golf course organizers golfed along with the men. To name a few were Arletta Day, Mrs. PR Olsen, Mrs. G Devlin, Mrs. T Crawford, Mrs. Frank Day Mrs. Dosdahl. This course was abandoned in a few years.

A second attempt at the golf course was suggested by Dave Aldous and constructed in the Coronach school yard site. At first Dave Aldous made one fairway and hole to the north of the present schoolyard and another one to the south of the school. He said he used to knock a ball or two back-and-forth with his #5 five iron. He said that Marvin Day had a set of wooden shafted golf clubs and would join him in the schoolyard. Next person interested was John Wilson who also had some clubs. The three of them spoke of what could be done to improve their course. There was a large areas south of town which belong to the municipality. The municipality was not too eager to say they could use it but did finally agree to let them

At the same time there was a man named Par Fletcher, son of Pat Fletcher of Saskatoon who was a wellknown Canadian golf pro for 26 years. Per Fletcher was here working for the Imperial Oil drilling rig (which was Southwest of Lorne Elder's farm.) Together Par Fletcher and Mary Day with the help of Dave Aldous and John Wilson planned a layout for the golf course. These men decided on a three hole golf course and this project was completed by June of 1958. They dug the sod out with a spade and had some sand hauled in to make the greens. The tomato can was again used as the green cup. #1 hole was designed and built by John Wilson 212 yards, #2 hole was designed and built by Marvin Day 315 yards, and #3 hole was designed and prepared by Dave Aldous 400 yards, which is presently #9 hole at the present golf course. They played quite regularly on this course and if you went around three times you had a round of nine holes. As the summer wore on golf became impossible because of the wild grass.

In the spring of 1959 more people were interested in the game of golf and together they all decided to expand this course. It would now be made into a 6 hole course. #1hole still 212 yards, #2 hole still 315 yards, #3 hole 140 yards, #4 hole 235 yards, #5 hole 238 yards (which is now #7 fairway) and #6 hole 400 yards (still #9 fairway today.) A few of the names mentioned where Marv Day, Don Day, Greg Day, Dave Aldous, Henry Nelson, Frank Barrett, Fred Lichter, John Dosch, Alex Thompson, John Wilson, George Nelson, Don Beattie, Harold Clark, Paul Dosch, Ken Elder, Don Henderson, Dave Beattie and Doug Hicks. The flag pins were about 31" long made by John Dosch and George Nelson. These pins had a sharp end to stick through the tomato can and into the ground. Some of the scrapers were made by John Dosch and George Nelson and a friend of Par Fletchers named Mike, who also worked for Imperial Oil Drilling Co. Sand for the greens was hauled by truck and trailers and was never screened. Later GT Curran supplied used oil to moisten the sand for grooming.

#1 fairway was built close to the town dumping ground. Many loads of iron, tin, etc. had to be hauled away. Much of this was hauled away by Alex Thompson. The first tractor purchased was a 1941 John Deere model B purchase from Joe Degrand for \$150, which seem to last forever. The first mower, a gang type was purchased from the Scobey golf club for \$150. Marv Day and John Dosch had quite a time clearing it through customs as they valued it at \$14,000. After a few phone calls to Moose Jaw the duty was finally based on the value of \$150. A nine ton roller was constructed at the George Nelson garage, formally where the Conexus Credit Union is today. One of the many men who contributed to this project was Dr. Tom Jackson. The stub axles came from an old separator from the Fred Thompson farm. Evan Scott assisted with the building of the first clubhouse, which was basically a booth, which sat where #1 tee off is today. Dwayne Willford used his backhoe to remove any huge rocks from the fairway areas.

The first tournament was organized by the club executive and was held on October 18, 1959 with 20 entries. There were three flights categorized by the score normally averaged in previous games. Winners for that day were noted: first flight winner Marv Day, second Fred Licter second flight winner Frank Barrett, second Gordon Skjerven, flight three winner was Greg Day second was Don Day.

In the late 1980s with the addition of the Sask power industry and the Poplar River Mine many more employees from these industries joined forces to keep the course golf course improving. With the volunteer help of these extra workers and equipment, watered fairways and later watered grass greens were established on the Coronach golf course. A dugout providing water for the fairways was maintained for many years by Marv Holbrook.

In 1982 the CPR train station was moved from the railway track north of town to the golf course and was renovated, painted and shingled. Dennis Reiland and his fellow ironworkers and cement workers built an outdoor patio and a large barbeque on the south side of the building. Darlene Reiland organized a woman's work bee to renovate the inside of the building. Many tournaments and social events were held in this building, and still are today.

"Our club has been very fortunate all these years with all the volunteer labour and we wish to thank all those people, " said Mary, " and without their help we wouldn't have a golf course in Coronach. And in conclusion, I, Valerie would like to add, that with the continued help of the present day crews and staff at the Coronach golf club, we can continue to be thankful for the beautifully maintained course that we have.

In honour of my dad Marvin Day, a golf tournament was dedicated in his name called the "Marv Day Memorial" held every Father's Day weekend in Coronach. Without his inspiration and dedication from his many friends we would not have a golf course today.

What is the summer solstice?

This year it is Thursday, June 20



The 'longest' day of the year marks the middle of summer.

This is because the tilt of the Earth's axis is most aligned with the sun, providing us with the most daylight of the year.

When it ends, the nights will began to close in as our planet rotates away from the sun. Solstice comes from the Latin words sol, meaning Sun and sistere, meaning to come to a stop or stand still. On the day of the June solstice, the Sun reaches its northernmost position, as see from the Earth. At that moment, its zenith does not move north or south as during most other days of the year, but it stands still at the Tropic of Cancer. It then reverses its direction and starts moving south again.
