

Council Meeting The next Council Meeting is October 13, 2026 in Council Chambers at the Town Office. The public is welcome to attend.

Utility Billing Utility Bills will be mailed in October 2026. Bills are due by October 31, 2026. Interest is applied on November 1, 2026, at a rate of 5% on amounts outstanding. We thank you for your cooperation in advance.

Fall Yard Pickups- Oct 9 & 23 Yard waste must be in clear bags and tied. Branches must be no more than 6 feet in length (big branches do not have to be placed in bags). Please place branches parallel to curb. Public works staff will not pickup waste that is loose, in garbage bags, cardboard boxes, or in wheelbarrows. Please have yard waste at your curb the night before. Yard waste is considered leaves, garden waste, grass clippings, & branches.

Henry's Law becomes effective November 1, 2026- Carbon monoxide (CO) is an invisible, odourless and tasteless gas that can build up in enclosed spaces without occupants being aware and can pose a serious risk to your health and safety. On May 5, 2026, the Minister of Government Relations introduced Henry's Law, an amendment to the National Building Code. This amendment requires all residential suites in Saskatchewan, regardless of their location in the building, to have a carbon monoxide (CO) alarm installed. The enhanced regulations are named in honour of Henry Losco, who passed away from carbon monoxide poisoning in Regina in December 2025. Henry's Law will require CO alarms in all multi-unit residential buildings consisting of apartments, condominiums, houses with secondary suites and all other buildings with multiple residential suites by November 1, 2026, regardless of when the building was initially built or last renovated.

Dutch Elm Pruning Starting September 1, Saskatchewan residents can safely prune elm trees again as the annual pruning ban comes to an end. The provincial pruning ban is in place from April 1 to August 31 each year to help curb the spread of Dutch elm disease (DED). The fungus that causes DED is spread by elm bark beetles, which are most active during the ban period. Fresh cuts can attract the beetles and spread the disease to healthy trees. Whether you decide to hire someone to trim your trees or do it yourself, pruning correctly is important, to avoid damaging your trees or spreading diseases. If you hire someone, make sure they are qualified. In Saskatchewan, anyone who prunes elm trees commercially must have completed a provincially recognized training program or be supervised by someone who has. It is also critical to dispose of any elm wood promptly. The Coronach Transfer Site disposes of infected wood. It is illegal to store, use or transport (except for disposal) elm firewood, as the wood can carry the beetles that spread DED. For more information, or if you suspect an elm tree may have DED, contact the Town Office. The Town had one tree in the community test positive in 2026. The tree has since been removed and disposed of by the resident.

E Health Saskatchewan The first batch of health card renewal stickers are in the mail! Watch for the envelope from eHealth Saskatchewan. When your sticker arrives, place it in the corner of your health card to ensure uninterrupted health coverage.

Proclaim Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Day PROCLAMATION: 195.2026 Mamer/C. Martin: THAT Council proclaim pregnancy and infant loss awareness day: WHEREAS pregnancy loss, infant loss, and child loss affect thousands of families each year, leaving lasting impacts on parents, siblings, grandparents, and communities; and WHEREAS many families experience grief in silence and may face their loss without adequate awareness, understanding, or support from those around them; and WHEREAS Oak's Tree of Love, a Northern Ontario initiative founded in memory of Oak Beaudyn Noel, supports families who have experienced pregnancy loss, infant loss, and child loss through memory boxes, remembrance projects, advocacy, awareness, and community support; and WHEREAS this proclamation honours the memory of Oak Beaudyn Noel and all babies and children gone too soon while recognizing the importance of supporting bereaved families in our communities; and WHEREAS Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Day provides an opportunity to acknowledge the lives of babies and children gone too soon, honour their memories, and recognize the strength and resilience of grieving families; and WHEREAS increasing awareness helps reduce stigma, encourages compassionate support, and reminds bereaved families that they are not alone in their grief journey, while communities across Canada and around the world observe October 15 in remembrance of babies and children who are deeply loved and forever remembered; NOW THEREFORE, the Mayor and Council of the Town of Coronach do hereby proclaim Oct 15, 2026, as Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Day in Coronach & encourage residents to recognize, remember, and support families who have experienced the loss of a baby or child. **Carried.**

Bylaw 7.2026 A Bylaw to License and Regulate Animals is now passed. A section to note is the barking dogs section. It now states: Section 6.2 Barking or howling in a residential area is deemed to be a nuisance if the barking or howling: i) Occurs between the hours of: 1) 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. on a day other than a Sunday or holiday; or, 2) 10:00p.m. and 8:00 a.m. on a Sunday or holiday; and/or, ii) Persists for a period of: 1) Fifteen (15) consecutive minutes or longer; or, 2) 1 hour or longer, intermittently.
